oppsoing coaches worried with their defensive play



Gordie Welch and Mike Blouin were on the second team NVAC Div. All League, and Justin Perreault was an honorable mention.





Congratulations to Dale, Steve, and the team for their accomplishments and good luck to the team and coaches next year.



The 1980-1981 Hockey team started their practices on November 15, with 60 boys trying out for 36 slots, one of the largest turnouts ever.


